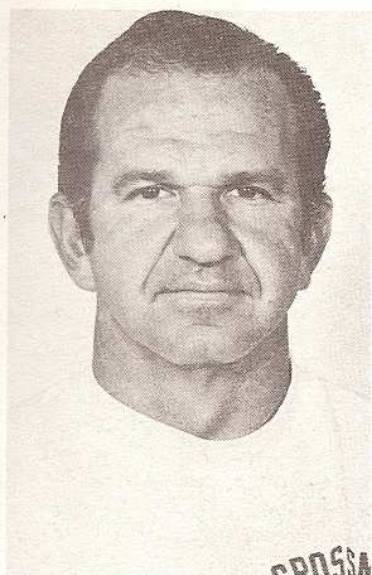

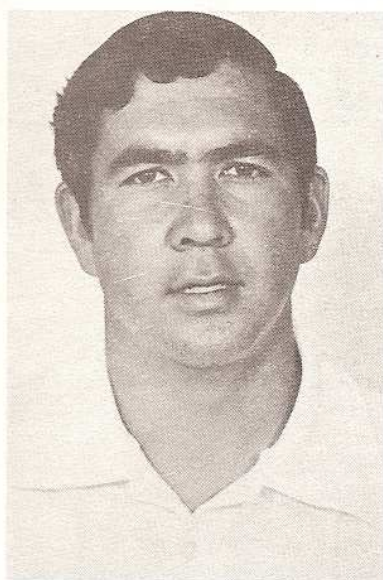


HEAD COACH DAVE JORDAN

When it comes to football coaching ability Grossmont College's Dave Jordan ranks among the best in the business. After a three-year varsity playing career at Compton High (1951-53), and two undefeated seasons at Compton Junior College (1954-55), Jordan played football under the famed George Allen at Whittier College in 1957. For an encore, Jordan played his senior year under the guidance of Don Coryell.

After five seasons of high school coaching in Central California and the rugged Los Angeles section of CIF where Jordan compiled a 33-11-2 record, the veteran mentor moved on to Cal State-Fullerton in 1969. He was an assistant coach at the four-year school for two seasons before moving on to Grossmont College in 1971.

In the last two years, Jordan has pushed for 22 scholarships to four-year institutions for the men who wore the Griffin Green and Gold.



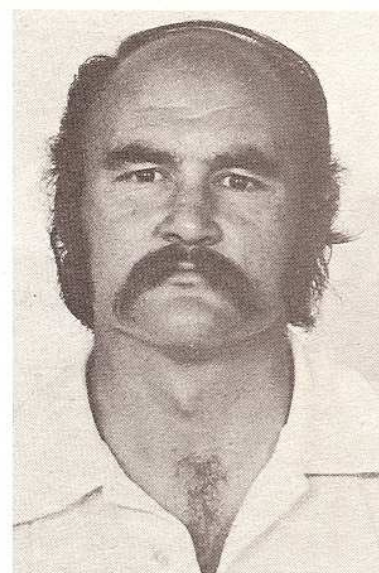
JACK MIYAMOTO

WAYNE WHITBY

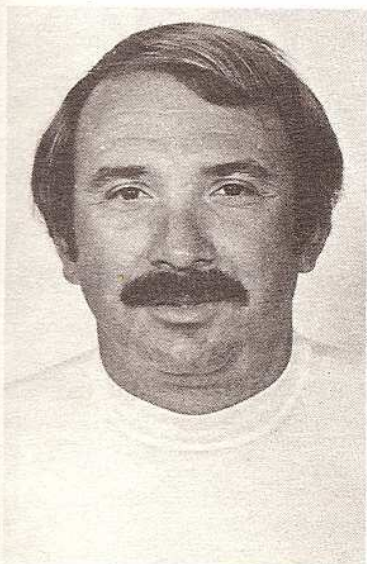

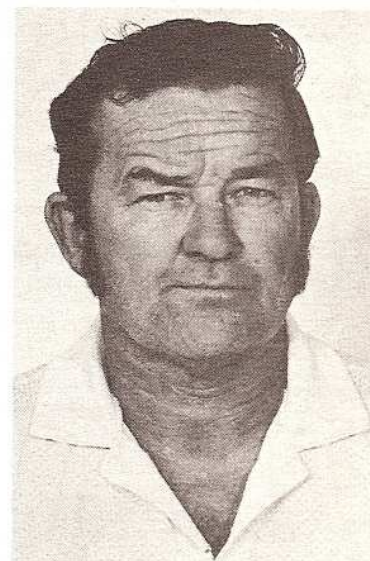

'74 COULD BE GREATEST G C FOOTBALL YEAR EVER

When coach Dave Jordan first greeted 118 athletes who showed up for the initial day practice in August, he could tell it was going to be a good year. For somewhere in that crowd of humanity had to be a football team.

After 3½ weeks of practicing, Jordan took his team to Anaheim to tangle with the No. 2 ranked community college football team, Fullerton College. The Griffins won the see-saw battle, 27-24, and that set the stage for what should be an outstanding season.

Grossmont goes into Mission Conference play expecting to be a contender. But the Griffins should receive strong competition for the conference championship from Citrus, San Diego City, Saddleback and possibly Riverside City College.

The Griffins are coming off a 7-2-1 1973 season which stands as the best in the college's 13-year football history. Jordan's club concluded that campaign with five straight victories.

Ten starters are returning from the '73 crew, including quarterback Joe Roth, wide receiver Dave Oliver, tight end Bill Helms, defensive tackle Jeff Walton, linebacker Randy Bowker and defensive back Bob Lucas. Roth passed for 1,417, hitting 141 of 250 aerials. Oliver was the main target as he nabbed 69 passes for 723 yards and four touchdowns. He was the top receiver in the nation.

In the 1974 season-opening win over Fullerton, the Griffins displayed some talented freshmen like wide receiver Don Kramer, who caught nine passes for 82 yards and one touchdown. First year running back Larry Downs also sparkled with 74 yards on just nine carries.

Before the season began, Jordan was worried about building an offensive line. Sure, he had lettermen Jim O'Donnell, Steve Rymer and Bill Dawson, but he needed help from the freshman ranks. Stepping in were sophomore transfer Ken Parris and freshmen Richard Ronk and Doug Bennett. Once again the Griffs figure to be strong up front.

Defensively, the Griffins should hold their own. The secondary appears to be stronger this year, but the line could be a little on the thin side as far as depth goes. Since mostly sophomores dot the linebacking areas, that phase of the game should be solid.

Jordan isn't making any predictions, but 1974 could be a very good year for Griffin football fans.

JOE ROTH OVERCOMES CANCER

As Joe Roth put on the football pads for the first time in 1974, he didn't want to talk about how many touchdown passes he was going to throw or make any predictions for the Griffins this fall.

He wanted to thank humanity. Nobody is happier to be alive than the 6-foot-3, 180-pound Griffin sophomore.

Only last May Roth was stricken with cancer. Fortunately, surgery corrected the problem and Roth is back in school and on the football field.

"It was like a nightmare," recalls the Granite Hills High graduate. "The doctors couldn't say how bad the cancer was until after the surgery. And even then, I had to lay in bed for two days and nights waiting for the results from the laboratory.

"The only thing that made the waiting bearable was the interest people showed in me. I never knew how many really good friends I had until I went into the hospital. The phone was ringing constantly, and I received numerous cards and letters wishing me well. I heard from about 1,000 people I guess. It really made me feel great.

"There's no way I can thank each person individually, although I appreciate them more than I can express in words."

The cancer actually caught Roth by surprise. One day he went to the doctor to have a mole removed and less than one week later he was in the hospital.

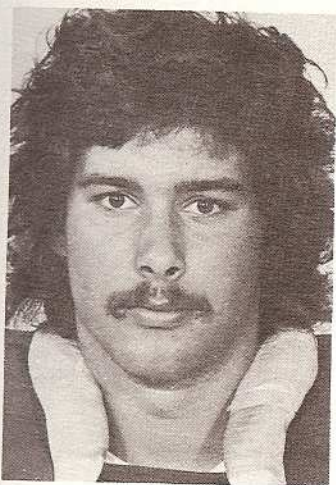
"Things were passing by me so fast I didn't know what to make of it. I was in shock. One day I was throwing a football, and the next day I was in surgery."

With the nightmare now behind him, Roth says he's "reevaluated his life. I don't take anything for granted anymore. I'm really grateful to be able to play this game of football. I appreciate the game more than ever before.

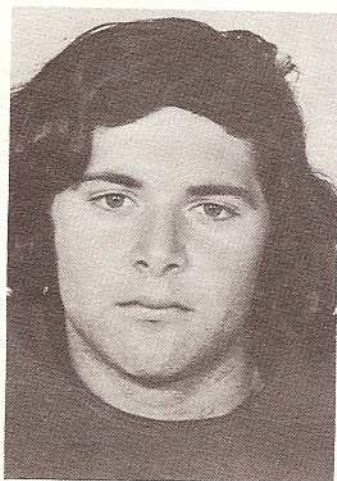
"The doctors said one reason I came out of the operation so well was because I was in good physical condition.

"And I guess I owe that to football."

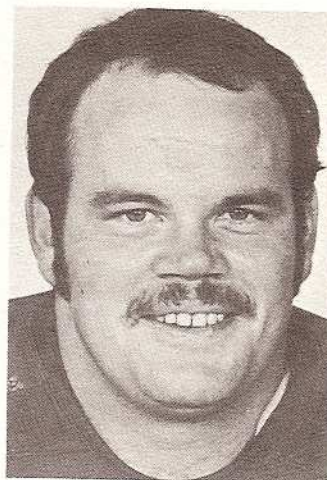

SASKA — G C'S HOWLING LINEBACKER

Could be Grossmont College's Tom Saska is a frustrated singer. Or possibly, he's part wolf. At least the 5-foot-10, 180-pound Griffin sophomore linebacker doesn't miss an opportunity to "howl" at the opposition while on the football field.

"When you're hot, you're usually having fun," says the Santana High graduate. "And when I'm having fun I like to howl. It's contagious. When I start doing it, other guys on the team do it, too. It excites the whole defense.

"When we started doing it at Fullerton, they spent more time staring at us than concentrating on what they were supposed to be doing."

Saska made a team high 15 tackles in Grossmont's 27-24 upset of second-ranked Fullerton September 14th and thus was named defensive player of the week.

"I know we've only played one game this year, but I'm really having a lot of fun even in practice. Junior college football is fun. There's a more relaxed atmosphere here than in high school. A high school program has to be more disciplined because there are not as many good athletes as there are at this level. They need discipline to perform. Here, they expect you to know how to play football, at least fundamentally."

When Saska speaks of the fun he's having this year, he still must prove himself to each new opponent. "I'm sure most teams try to come my way a little more because I'm pretty small for a college linebacker. But I try to read the keys so that I can get to the ball before a blocker can get to me."

Linebacker coach Jack Miyamoto is not bothered by Saska's physical characteristics. "Tommy has a real fine feel for the game. He has the instinct to be in the right place to make a tackle and he really unloads on people. I'd like to have another one like him."

Looking ahead, Saska hopes to continue playing football at a four-year college. "I know I'm going to have to fight the size prejudice. Any coach who takes me will think he's gambling, but I hope there is somebody out there who isn't afraid to take a chance.

"Football is a big part of my life right now. I want to play it for as long as I can."
